
A new move date of May 26th has been confirmed for our move to Nelson Hall for worship services while our sanctuary is being renovated! Watch for future updates and details in The Beat!

Accordingly, do we also limit our perception of who God is when we use language that identifies the creator as a patriarchal father, a shepherd, a king or even as our rock? If we are all created in the image of God, what of the femininity?

Confirmation, Rites of Passage, and Graduation Sunday

This Sunday, there will not be any children or youth classes. We would like the children to stay in service to witness these important events

Summary:

Children's Enrichment- The lesson was Appreciating and Respecting your mother figures. The class shared about their plans for Mother's Day and the things the children made or bought for their mothers. The children were very excited about their plans for this special day. With coloring pages, we looked briefly at the mothers from the bible that the children knew from our studies. Moses had two mothers: Jochebed (birth mother) and the Pharaoh's daughter (adoptive mother). Eve was the first mother, and Mary was the mother of Jesus. Next, we looked through the 10 commandments to find the commandment about respecting your mother. When I asked about the meaning of respect, the children gave many good ideas. I explained further about respect as admiring their mother, who is amazing and should be treated well. Then the class was given markers, stickers, and cardstock to make special cards for all the mothering figures in their lives.



BISHOPS PANTRY

WANTED: OUR INVENTORY IS CRITICALLY LOW! We are especially in need of the following: cereal boxes, jars of peanut butter (large and small), soup (pop tops preferred), cans of vegetables, chili, ravioli, canned fruit and hygiene items (e.g. travel size shampoo, body wash, lotion, etc.).

Helping the homeless couldn't be easier! Next time you do your grocery shopping, simply pick up a few of the items listed below and drop it off at the front office. We'll take care of the rest! Please make note of the expiration dates on your donations-We can't accept items with expired dates!

For a complete list, stop by the information desk in the foyer. Some of the essential staple items needed are: CANNED FRUIT, VEGETABLES, PEANUT BUTTER, JELLY, CRACKERS, SOUPS, BEEF STEW, CHILLI. RAVIOLI, DRY PASTA, SPAGHETTI SAUCE, MAC & CHEESE BOXES, CANNED TUNA & MEATS, & BREAKFAST BARS & CEREAL. WE HAVE PLENTY OF APPLESAUCE AND DRIED BEANS & RICE FOR NOW. HYGEINE ITEMS ARE ALSO NEEDED.

ICM (Interfaith Community Ministry) is always in need of clothing, food, and household items. If you are cleaning out cupboards and closets, before you discard, give thought to the possibility that ICM clients could use it. ICM serves the low income working people, after they pay their rent and utilities, there is very little money left. We can lend a helping hand!
