



In Memorium





REV. DR. KEN BUCKWALD

Reverend Dr. Ken Buckwald, former associate minister of Church of the Beatitudes and president emeritus and CEO of The Beatitudes Campus of Care, passed away peacefully on Sunday, September 22, 2019. Rev. Buckwald joined Church of the Beatitudes in 1967 as associate minister serving as parish pastor for seven years. In 1974, he became president and CEO of The Beatitudes Campus serving for 25 years before retiring in 1999. He served both communities faithfully for many years, remaining active throughout retirement along with his wife, Norma who continues to serve.

Rev. Buckwald's legacy at the Beatitudes organizations is formidable. From the 9,984 square foot Worship Center built on the corner of Glendale and 7th Avenue in 1974, to the construction of The Beatitudes Campus of Care, this "builder" of communities, both physically and spiritually, leaves a footprint that is undeniable. In an interview in 2013 with The Council for Health and Human Service Ministries (CHHSM), he said, "My ministry has been blessed and fulfilling. My confirmation verse and my ordination scripture spell out my goal: 'Be faithful unto death and I will give you the crown of life.'" Rev. Ken Buckwald will be greatly missed by all who knew and loved him. A memorial gathering will be held Sunday, October 13, at 12 noon at the Beatitudes Campus in the Life Center.





Helping the homeless couldn't be easier! Next time you do your grocery shopping, simply pick up a few of the items listed below and drop it off at the front office. We'll take care of the rest! Please make note of the expiration dates on your donations-We can't accept items with expired dates!

For a complete list, stop by the information desk in the foyer. Some of the essential staple items needed are: CANNED FRUIT, VEGETABLES, PEANUT BUTTER, JELLY, CRACKERS, SOUPS, BEEF STEW, CHILLI. RAVIOLI, DRY PASTA, SPAGHETTI SAUCE, MAC & CHEESE BOXES, CANNED TUNA & MEATS, & BREAKFAST BARS & CEREAL. WE HAVE PLENTY OF APPLESAUCE AND DRIED BEANS & RICE FOR NOW, HYGEINE ITEMS ARE ALSO NEEDED.

ICM (Interfaith Community Ministry) is always in need of clothing, food, and household items. If you are cleaning out cupboards and closets, before you discard, give thought to the possibility that ICM clients could use it. ICM serves the low income working people, after they pay their rent and utilities, there is very little money left. We can lend a helping hand!
